Collection location

- Many Archaeology books are located on the **3rd floor, North Block**
- All Archaeology books available on open access in the History collection will display the location ARCHAEOLOGY, with the classmark prefix 63 eg ARCHAEOLOGY North Block 3rd floor (63) LAD Loc
- Most periodicals are shelved in a separate alphabetical sequence of History and Archaeology periodicals through the Institute of Classical Studies, 3rd floor, South Block – see the online A-Z list of periodicals: www.shl.lon.ac.uk/subjects/history/index.shtml
- Recent issues of periodicals are on display bays in the Goldsmiths' Room – **4th floor, South Block**
- Some items are held in the closed access stacks. These will display the location **Stack Service**. Please ask at Issue Desk, 4th floor or see our website for further details
