

Hispanic American Periodicals Index (HAPI)

About this database

Subject areas covered	Social Sciences and Humanities: Central and South America, Mexico, Brazil, the Caribbean basin, the United States-Mexico border region, and Hispanics/Latinos in the United States.
Date of coverage	1970 – present. 275,000 citations from more than 500 key social science and humanities journals published throughout the world.
Types of publication covered	Journals, book reviews, documents, literary works.
Does it include full text?	Yes, <u>some</u> access to full-text. However please be aware that another of the databases we subscribe to, entitled <u>PRISMA</u> (Publicaciones y Revistas Sociales y Humanísticas), does provide the full text of key articles indexed in HAPI (see note at the end of this help sheet).
Currency of information	HAPI Online grows at the rate of about 7,000 records a year.

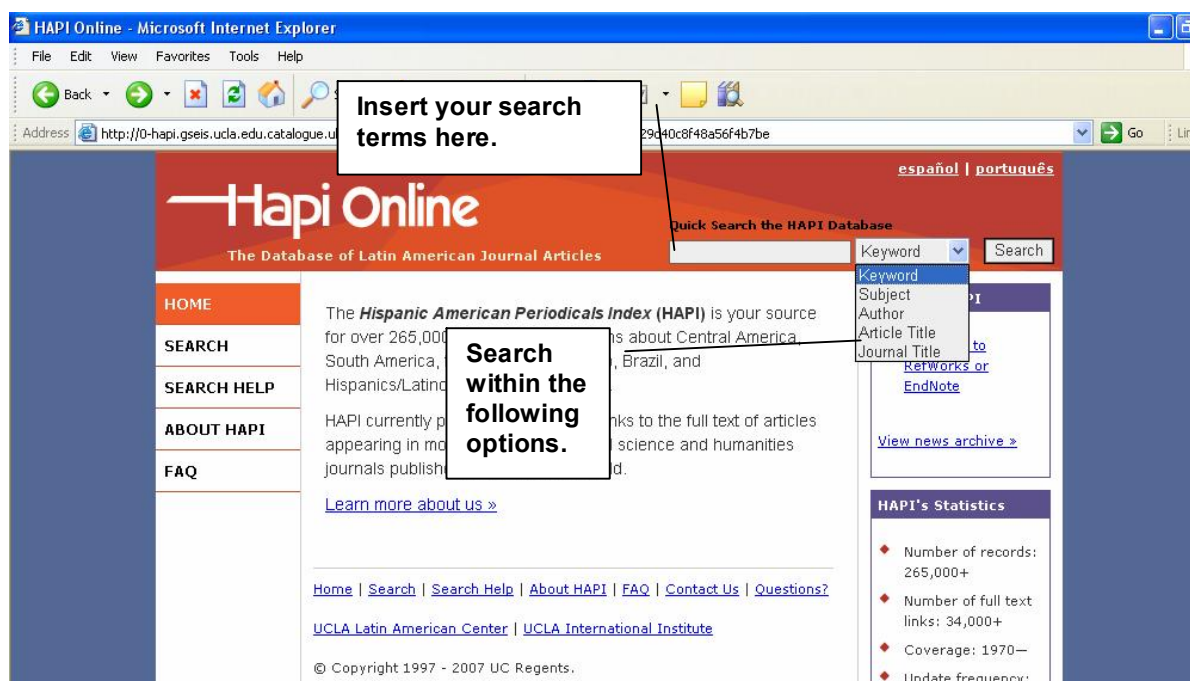

Search options in this database



Basic Search

The Search For box on the homepage allows you to run a keyword search in:

- Keyword
- Subject
- Author
- Article Title
- Journal Title

Also, for a list of journals indexed by HAPI, you can click on About HAPI and then select Journals Indexed by HAPI.


Advanced Search

To access advanced search click on Search in the left hand menu. Advanced search allows you to further refine your search by date and language.

You can search for full-text only, exclude book reviews in your search and limit your search to citations about U.S. Latinos/ Hispanics.

It also allows you to identify search terms used within the database by clicking on “check thesaurus”.



Marking Records

HAPI allows you to 'mark' (select) the records you find useful. You can do this by clicking on the Add to Marked List box below each record.

If you select View Marked List (at the top right of the screen) you can view all of the records you have marked. You can then e-mail, print or download the records you have marked into Endnote.
